Glenfield to Wasdale Head

Wasdale Head is the walker's Mecca.

Nowhere in England has grander scenery or more perfect walking country. On the approach, to the left, is Buckbarrow, modest in height but intimidating in aspect. Near vertical cliffs appear to tower over Wastwater and the viewpoint, near the summit, provides a stunning panorama of the highest and most dramatic mountains in the country.

From then on it only gets better.

At the head of the valley are three mountains that, combined with the lake, provided the inspiration for the National Park logo.

Yewbarrow, loved by many and feared by most, can be walked from end to end if you have the courage. Great Gable is the home of fell-walkers and a

symbol in its own right. Whether you visit Westmorland cairn for the finest viewpoint in England or join hundreds of others for the remembrance service, a very moving experience indeed, you will never forget your visit to Gable. Neglected Lingmell, mostly ignored by visitors to Scafell Pike but within easy distance and very little deviation offering magnificent crags towards Styhead.

Before these lies the Mosedale horseshoe, less visited than the famous fells but with superb scenery culminating in the mighty Pillar.

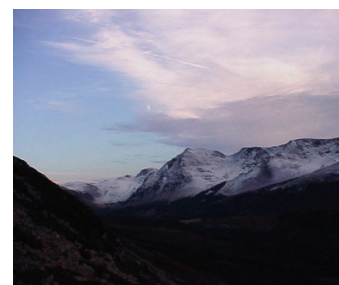
Then the Scafell massif, the highest mountains in England, being rough and uncomfortable underfoot but not to be missed. The oft bypassed Great End should be visited, Scafell Pike must not be ignored,

and the volcanic cone of Scafell is an exciting place to be. The path from Scafell Pike to Scafell is difficult with no direct route but, if time and energy allow, it can be accomplished via Mickle-dore and Foxes Tarn.

That leaves the summits of Ilgill Head and Whin Rigg atop the mighty Wastwater Screes.

This is all serious walking country, not to be taken lightly or without protective clothing, supplies, map or compass.

This is a place that will succour body and soul.



Planning the journey for Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays

The journey can be made by No. 6 bus from Whitehaven to Gosforth or by train from Corkickle to Seascale. The train service does not run on Sundays.

The No. 13 Wasdale Taxibus connects Seascale and Gosforth to Wasdale Head. Due to licensing

laws the taxibus **will only carry passengers and run if it is pre-booked** 019467 25308.
